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Jail Data Link

The Issues:

A large number of individuals with mental illnesses were becoming involved with the criminal justice system for various reasons and were detained. Some individuals had received inpatient treatment in one of the hospitals operated by the Division of Mental Health or they had been, were or could have been receiving mental health treatment in the community.

If the individual was receiving mental health treatment, the provider who was working with the individual may not have been aware of their detention thus the treatment process was interrupted. Additionally the justice system may not have been aware of the individual's prior mental health issues and treatment needs.

Jail Data Link

The Issues:

There was a need to develop a secure and confidential mechanism to locate and identify these individuals and to link them back to their treatment provider (if they wished to continue receiving treatment) for continuity of care purposes. Based on an individual's needs he/she may also have been linked to a new treatment provider as appropriate.

There was a need to develop a linkage and collaboration between mental health community providers and the justice system (i.e., jails) to address individuals' mental health needs.

Description of Jail Data Link Program

The Jail Data Link program provides a web based cross-match between participating county jail databases for individuals included in their daily census with individuals identified as receiving mental health treatment purchased by DHS/DMH. The program is used to identify individuals in the targeted mental health population that should be involved in services with community mental health providers, but have been detained in jail. The program utilizes case management staff of participating community providers to link individuals detained in county jails to community based mental health services.

The program also has the potential to link to a DHS/DMH created Problem Solving Court Database.

Historical Development of Jail-Data Link Project

- The initial idea for the project was conceived as a "no new state money" or budget neutral project that was part of a Federal grant. Also at this point in time agencies were receiving grant dollars that help to support their participation and "in reach" activities.
- Prior this initiative, the State Mental Health Confidentiality Act prevented the sharing of information with the justice system. Legislation enacted changed the State Mental Health Confidentiality Act (740ILCS 110/9.2) to allow data sharing and compliance with HIPAA.
- The first Collaboration included Cook County Jail, Cermak Health Service, and several DMH contracted Region I Agencies.
- > The current partnership has since expanded to additional county jails and their associated providers, Will, Peoria, Winnebago, St Clair, Rock Island, Macon, McLean, and Champaign.

Legal Basis for the Data Matching Initiative

91-0536 which modified the Mental Health and Developmental Disabilities Administrative Act. This act allows the Division of Mental Health, community agencies funded by DMH, and any Illinois county jail to disclose a recipient's record or communications, without consent, to each other, for the purpose of admission, treatment, planning, or discharge. No records may be disclosed to a county jail unless the Department has entered into a written agreement with the specific county jail. Effective July 12, 2005, the Illinois

General Assembly also adopted **Public Act 094-0182**, which further modified the Mental Health and Developmental Disabilities Administrative Act to allow sharing between the Illinois Department of Corrections and DMH.

Usefulness of Jail Data Link

- Identifies individuals that have previous documented community MH services or inpatient DMH treatment that can be linked back to their agency of record, or linked to a new agency based on their individual needs.
- Assists in screening candidates for Problem Solving Courts. Currently there are 6 courts.
- Tracks the number of individuals with documented histories of mental health treatment to support local MH system planning efforts.


How Jail-Data-Link Works


- On a daily basis, a "cross match" is initiated using a unique numeric identifier, of all individuals detained in County Jails with the state-wide DMH community services roster, generated using the DMH Community Information System, and with a State Hospital roster generated from the DMH State Hospital Inpatient Information System. The results of the cross-match is provided to participating agencies, jails, mental health courts.
- Provides clinical, demographic and historical information to agencies, jails, problem solving courts, state's attorneys', and other criminal justice specialists for utilization in continuity of care, determination of services, and for community reintegration follow up.

How Jail-Data-Link Works

- The Jail Data Link works best when there is a dedicated liaison/case manager on staff who can track and facilitate the process.
- The result is the creation of an "interactive and dynamic" database that facilitates communication between users.

Key Jail Data Link Roles

Agency Case Manager

- Maintain a user ID with DMH
- Open and Review Database (Case manager Agency Only)
- Prioritize cases for Linkage & Establish Linkage
- Maintain Liaison with Jail
 Staff, DMH Forensic Staff/IT
- Advise DMH on Issues with Access

Jail Administration

- Determine IT Liaison to DMH
- Determine which Jail staff will Open and prioritize cases
- Jail Social Work/Case management staff can prioritize any agency case for linkage

What Happens After the Cross-Match Occurs?

- Further screening occurs to determine an individual's eligibility for linkage to community mental health providers.
- ➤ If eligible for linkage, the individual's information is added to the jail database link program and linkage process proceeds with designated Case Managers.
- ➤ If not eligible for linkage, due to exclusionary criteria, the information is retained in the database, although individuals continue through the justice process.



JAIL DATA LINK Program Selected Screen Shots

All users must log into the website utilizing a specific user name, password and four digit PIN for which permission access level has been granted. A PIN number cannot be changed by ANY personnel except one self and a DHS Central Management Authorizer.



Terms and conditions are required like most SSL (Secure Socket Layer) sites; the click on the agreement button registers WHO is accessing the site and WHEN. This information is used for audit and security purposes.



All data presented here is considered to be the property of the State of Illinois and the Department of Human Services. The data is available for authorized users only and it's use and dissemination is protected by applicable Federal and State statutes and laws, and policies of the Illinois Department of Human Services. Menus drive where a user may go; however, the data revealed is driven by the technology and security levels in the software and permissions given.



Based on security level, users will be able to see their individualized client information. Each agency may only review clients associated with their agency. An individual may have multiple records depending upon the number of agencies with whom the person is associated.

Each menu will drive another drill down menu permitting users to toggle forward and backward easily.



Jail Data Link provides real time information on individuals who are detained. The "detainee released within 30 day" file and an archival database permit users to have access to information captured for any individual since the inception of the data link program expansion phase (2006).
